This paper identifies key questions that are being asked about the role and impact of multinational companies (MNCs) and then reviews the types of statistics that are required to answer those questions. The paper goes on to assess whether the statistics collected by the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) are adequate to address those questions. In so doing, it highlights questions that cannot be readily answered just through data collections but that also require the use of economic theory, modeling techniques, and statistical inference. Finally, it identifies steps that might be considered to address data weaknesses and to help policy makers and other data users better answer the important questions that they now are asking about the impact of MNCs.

Globalization and Poverty

University of Chicago Press Over the past two decades, the percentage of the world's population living on less than a dollar a day has been cut in half. How much of that improvement is because of—or in spite of—globalization? While anti-globalization activists mount loud critiques and the media report breathlessly on globalization's perils and promises, economists have largely remained silent, in part because of an entrenched institutional divide between those who study poverty and those who study trade and finance.
